

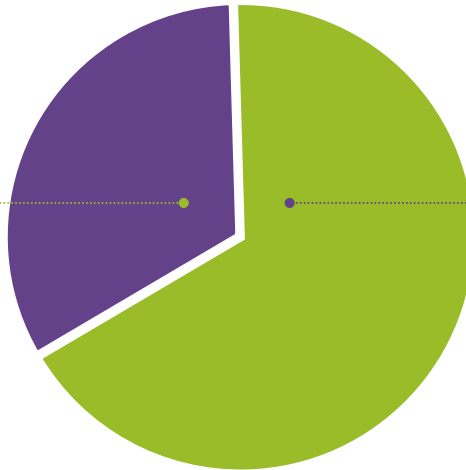
WHAT HAPPENED IN THE 2016/17 OFSTED SECONDARY SCHOOL INSPECTIONS?



We analysed 776 Secondary school inspections and this is what we found.

The General Bits

33%
were short inspections



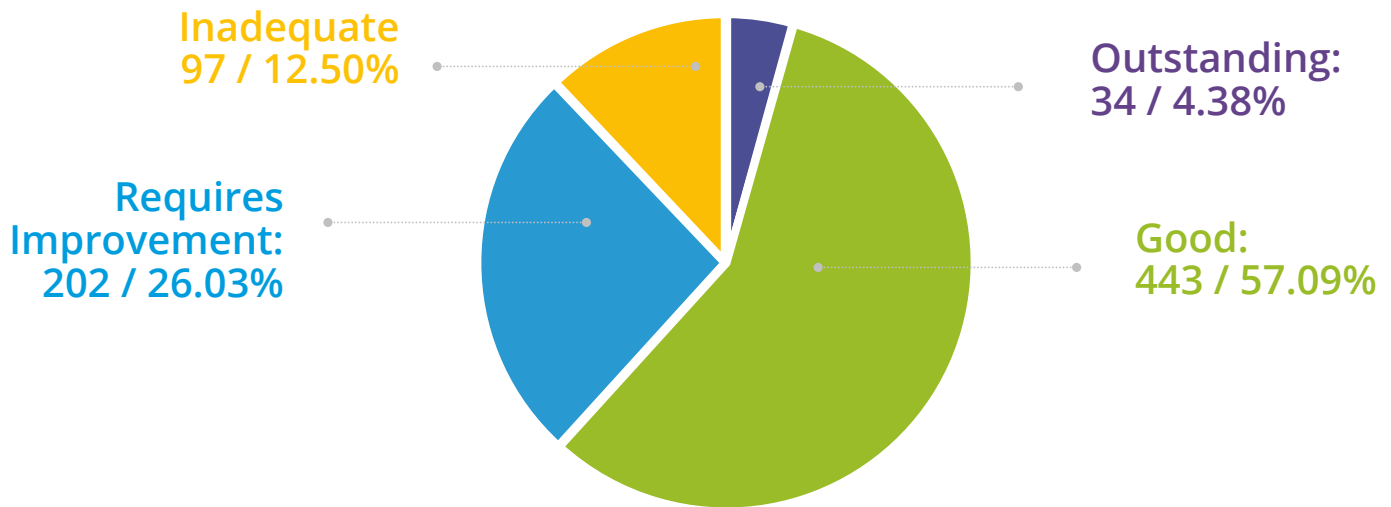
67%
were full inspections



The average time between inspections was 3 years, 3 months

The Good News

61% of inspected schools were good or better



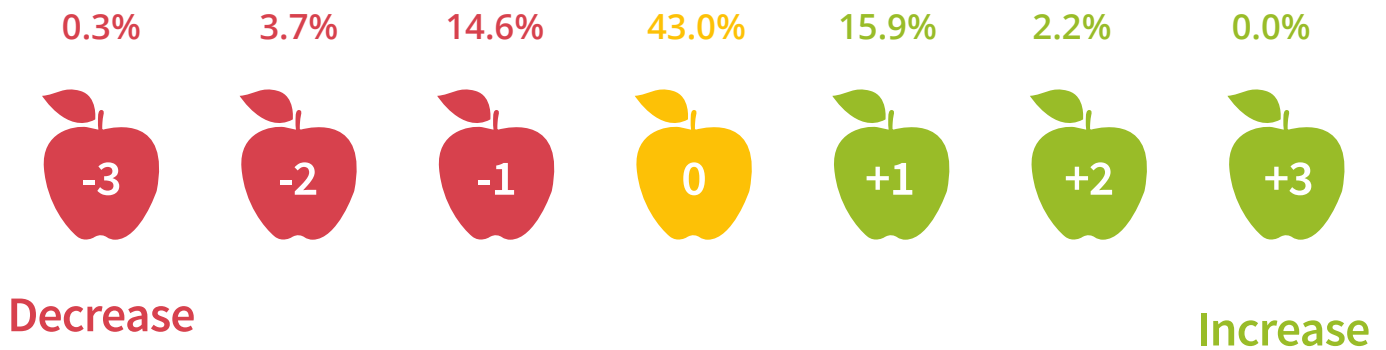
A Deeper Look

How many schools improved, stayed the same or decreased from their previous grade?



*20.4% of schools did not have a previous inspection grade

The Breakdown of Grade Movement



*Where numbers do not add up to 100% it's because there were 158 schools without a prior grade

The Juicy Bits



If you were an **Outstanding** school you were equally likely to move to Good or Requires Improvement.

If you were a **Good** school you were most likely to remain as Good.

If you were a **Requires Improvement** school you were most likely to remain as Requires Improvement.

If you were an **Inadequate** school you were most likely to become Requires Improvement.

The Glass Ceiling of Good

94%

of schools who were Good either remained as such or got worse.

Only 6% of Good schools became Outstanding.
